2021 Optician Of The Year Criteria:


- 1. Must be a member of the Opticians Association of Washington in good standing

**Intellectual Challenge;** For leaders who are always curious to learn more things, board duties will provide a rewarding intellectual challenge.


**Makes You Better at Your Current Job**; Simply listening to others in your meetings will provide you cross-functional information on ways to approach problems and find new solutions.
